usan Hat eld joined the faculty of Winona State University (WSU) in 1981. Since then, she has taught in the Communication Studies department, served for nine years as chairperson of that department, and served for 14 years as WSU's Assessment Coordinator.

As Assessment Coordinator, Dr. Hat eld worked with numerous departments on developing and implementing plans to assess student learning at the program level. She has also



worked with programs as they prepared their professional accreditation portfolios for organizations such as ABET, AACSB, and NCATE.

Dr. Hat eld is peer evaluator for the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) and is currently a Senior Scholar with the HLC's Academy projects.

Publications include several book chapters and articles, as well as the book *e Seven Principles in Action*, which she served as editor and a chapter author.

Dr. Hat eld has received a Kellogg Fellowship as one of the Emerging Leaders in Higher Education, and has been named Outstanding College Teacher in the State of Minnesota by the Minnesota House of Representatives. She completed her undergraduate degree in Education and Master's degree in Organizational Communication from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. She earned her doctorate in Communication eory from the University of Minnesota.
